Quinns Lead Diversified Life

Bob and Tiese Quinn led an extraordinary life before making University Village home. They owned and operated a civil engineering firm, packed guests on horses into the Southern Sierra and were greatly involved in Ojai activities.


After graduating from UCLA with a degree in Engineering, Bob worked for the County of Los Angeles while Tiese worked for a civil engineering firm in Gardena. Serendipity brought them together across a subdivision plan at the County. Tiese hired Bob, and the duo worked together for 10 years, as good friends before becoming owners and partners in the firm and in life.

In 1982 the Quinns took a break from engineering and bought Kennedy Meadows Pack Station and Jordan Hot Springs Resort located in the Sierra Nevada mountains, again serendipitously. After seeing an ad for Jordan Hot Springs Resort in Sunset Magazine, Tiese made reservations and they backpacked in. The owner mentioned they were selling and asked Tiese if she knew anyone wanting to buy. Tiese enthusiastically replied, "We do!" and dragged Bob off on an adventure of a lifetime. They soon found they had purchased some dilapidated structures and over 50 horses and mules.

Home base for the pack station was an old ranger station. From there they sold meals, supplies, propane and gasoline, and offered hourly rides or longer group trips on horses while packing all the comforts of home on mules. "Doing what you love doesn't pay very well," Bob realized before too long. After four years, they sold the business and purchased 40 acres in the mountains, where they lived off-grid for 14 more years with Bob commuting to work at the engineering firm and Tiese working from home.

The Quinn's new home was located some 50 miles from any store and 22 miles of winding road from a telephone. Both are California Naturalists and enjoyed seeing the deer, bear, and mountain lion neighbors. One night a young

bear invaded their pantry searching for food. It left quite a mess! A welcome guest at their home was a raccoon they Ranger. named Ranger became the best pet, a special animal. remembers Tiese. Ranger, who lived with the Quinns for three years, would actually pet their dogs.



In 1994 the owner of the engineering firm decided to retire. The Quinns purchased and moved the business and its employees to Torrance, with Tiese as Chief Financial Officer and Bob as Chief Executive Officer designing infrastructure for subdivisions, commercial and industrial projects, as well as conducting topographical surveys. Tiese insisted on retirement in 2015 and the firm was sold.

After their sojourn in the mountains, they had relocated to Bakersfield and purchased property with room for the remaining horses. Tiese is a nomad and sometimes needs to pack up her teepee and move to greener pastures, so after nine years in Bakersfield it was off to Ojai for eleven years, giving Bob a much shorter commute than he had enjoyed since the sale of the pack station.

Living in an historical home in Ojai inspired Tiese who was appointed to the Ojai Historical Preservation Commission where she served as Vice Chair. She also served as Board Member and President of the Ojai Women's Committee, the major fundraising group for the Ojai Music Festival, all while continuing as a Fiber Artist and showing her works in a local gallery. Bob and Tiese are now working on repurposing knitting needles into bracelets.

They are happy to call University Village their Forever Home where a major benefit is having more time for projects and interests.
