Retiring Resident Council Members

As they review their terms of office on Resident Council, the four retiring members recall a time like no other in the fourteen-year history of University Village's governing body. Historically, meetings are open to all residents; how was the Council to deal with pandemic "closure" during 2020 and 2021? The answer was Zoom, challenging to all. While it did enable participation not only by the Council but by residents who joined the on-line meetings, the format has not been missed since most in-person meetings began to resume in May this year!



Terms will end on December 31 for Sandee Kane. Mark Landau, Sylvia Lodato and Judy Nichols. As they recently discussed Resident Council accomplishments of 2020 and 2021, they quickly pointed to the success of the Employee Appreciation Fund. Isolated in their homes, most residents had little in-person interaction with staff members for many months. Yet service flourished, often in new ways. The current Council encouraged contributions to the Fund through an attractive brochure featuring UVTO employees – information rewarded by record giving in 2021, including participation of OakView residents and their families.

Sandee Kane, 2021 Resident Council Chair, recalled the conversation at which the group selected its leadership for the current year - including the wishes of several members' spouses! Sandee agreed to serve, initiating her gracious reports at Town Hall meetings. Traditionally, these meetings have been televised, but Channel 1390 audience size increased dramatically during the pandemic, another unique experience for retiring members.

Mark Landau is a strong proponent of resident budget awareness and a high level of transparency as UVTO owners make financial decisions affecting residents' lifestyles. He advocates for sympathetic treatment of those who are not as self-sufficient as "independent living" might infer, and has helped prevent what he calls erosion of benefits under economic pressures.

Sylvia Lodato recalls revisions of the Bylaws over a two-year period –adding a new article defining the conduct of electronic meetings, and changing the term of Council membership from two to three years. As Committee Election Coordinator in 2020 and Convener of Building Representatives in 2021, she has been impressed by the broad, active involvement of so many residents contributing to the way of life at UVTO.

Judy Nichols encourages residents to attend Resident Council meetings, and emphasizes the value of Committee work - perhaps the result of her coordinating the Standing Committees. Liaison to the Bereavement Committee, she stresses the importance of the Tribute Table which recognizes the passing of UVTO residents. Judy also appreciates the occasional privilege of speaking directly with UVTO's owners, as a Council benefit/responsibility.

As to plans for the future, one retiree suggested "Sleep for a year!" Personal relaxation will include hiking, golf, pickleball, and not-so-physical bridge, reading and writing letters to friends. But these active folks also anticipate continued committee attendance and probable membership. Their interest in University Village government continues, enhanced by these past two years. Thank you -- Sandee, Mark, Sylvia and Judy -for giving yourselves to us!
