A Word to the Wise

For those of us uncertain about how to deal with the loss of a significant other in terms of dealing with all kinds of financial and tax records, there are several ways to be prepared for this situation. Basically, you need to be educated and \P be sure you and your loved one have made all the necessary preparations. The consequences of not being prepared can be very traumatic, especially in a time of dealing with the loss.



Resources that are available include: A son or daughter or other trusted relative who is totally familiar with all your financial and tax records and who has a clear understanding of your wishes; a financial adviser; an estate attorney; a fiduciary; or other licensed advisor.

The first step that we're pretty sure everyone has taken is to have a family trust, prepared by a professional. This may be single trust, or in the case so common here, a separate trust for each partner. This step takes care of some of the items mentioned above. A part of this should be an advance health care directive and the POLST* form that we all are required to complete.

Another step (that might be part of the trust) is the preparation of an estate plan, best done with the help of a professional. CA law changes often on this topic so it is best to be sure it is current.

UVTO management cannot and will not provide any direct assistance in this regard but can offer names of professionals that can help. But it is always better to start with a trusted relative. 1
